In accordance with this chapter, to establish training and certification standards for all <u>adult</u> corrections officers, set requirements for board-approved courses, prescribe curriculum and certify graduates of board-approved courses and persons for whom the board has waived the training requirements of this chapter Certification must be based on the officer's demonstration of having acquired specific knowledge and skills directly related to job performance, as a corrections officer who is responsible for the custody or direct supervision of persons confined in a county or regional jail or state adult correctional facility

30 1 **Required** As a condition to the continued employment of any person as a 31 corrections officer, that person must successfully complete, within the first 12 months of 32 employment, a basic training course as approved by the board The board may approve a 33 separate basic training course and certification standards for juvenile corrections officers 34 Thereafter, as a condition of continued employment as a corrections officer, the officer 35 must satisfactorily maintain the basic certification The board, under extenuating and 36 emergency circumstances in individual cases, may extend the 12-month period for not more 37 than 180 days The board, in individual cases, may waive basic training requirements when 38 the facts indicate that an equivalent course has been successfully completed in another state 39 or federal jurisdiction A full-time correctional trade instructor must meet the training 40 requirements established under this subsection for corrections officers Beginning January 41 1, 2018, the basic training course must include 8 hours of training in how to identify, 42 understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorder that is 43 provided by a trainer who is certified by a nationally recognized organization that provides 44 evidence-based mental health first aid training '

#### SUMMARY

This amendment provides for the training and certification of adult corrections officers and juvenile corrections officers and provides that the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy may approve a separate basic training course and certification standards for juvenile corrections officers. The amendment also provides that a corrections officer who is certified and an employee of a county or regional jail or state adult correctional facility on the date the board establishes a separate basic training course and certification standards for juvenile corrections officers must be certified as an adult corrections officer
