1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **CONCEPT DRAFT**

3 **SUMMARY**

4 This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.

5 This bill would:

6 1. Provide funding for the consolidation of the Department of Inland Fisheries and
7 Wildlife facilities by relocating to a larger building to be used as headquarters in the City
8 of Augusta, upgrading the wireless technology and installing secure badge-access
9 technology;

10 2. Authorize the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue securities in an
11 amount not to exceed \$43,450,000 outstanding at any one time for a headquarters facility
12 for the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife;

13 3. In the event that financing by the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority is not
14 feasible, authorize the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to issue a request for
15 proposals from private developers for a long-term lease for a headquarters facility for the
16 department; and

17 4. Authorize the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to purchase the
18 following parcels of land and any buildings thereon in the City of Augusta for a
19 headquarters facility for the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife:

20 A. Parcel 1: for \$1, the property formerly known as the Statler Tissue Company mill
21 property; and

22 B. Parcel 2: by eminent domain, an adjacent property located to the south of Parcel 1,
23 currently owned by A.I.M. Recycling.
