An Act to Require a 72-hour Waiting Period After the Sale of a Firearm

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2015 is enacted to read:
3	§2015. Waiting period after sale of firearm
4 5	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
6 7	A. "Agreement" means when a buyer and a seller reach an agreement for the purchase and the sale of a firearm.
8	B. "Firearm" has the same meaning as in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 12-A.
9 10	C. "Firearm dealer" means a person that is licensed as a dealer under 18 United States Code, Section 923 or that is required to be licensed as a dealer under that section.
11 12	2. Waiting period. A person may not knowingly deliver a firearm pursuant to a sale without withholding delivery of the firearm for at least 72 hours after agreement.
13	3. Penalty. This subsection applies to violations of subsection 2.
14 15	A. A person who violates subsection 2 commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$200 and not more than \$500 may be adjudged.
16 17 18	B. A person who violates subsection 2 after having previously been adjudicated as violating subsection 2 commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$500 and not more than \$1,000 may be adjudged.
19	4. Application. This section does not apply to:
20 21	A. The sale of a firearm if the seller knows that the person to whom the seller is selling the firearm is:
22	(1) A law enforcement officer; or
23 24 25	(2) A person who desires to purchase a firearm for use in promoting the public interest incidentally to the person's employment as a bank guard or armed truck guard or as a similar type of employee; or
26	B. The sale of a firearm to a firearm dealer.
27 28	A firearm dealer is subject to the requirements of conducting national instant criminal background checks under 18 United States Code, Section 922(t).
29	SUMMARY
30 31 32 33	This bill requires a 72-hour waiting period between an agreement for the purchase and sale of a firearm and its delivery to the purchaser and makes violation of the waiting period a civil violation with a \$200 to \$500 fine for the first violation and a \$500 to \$1,000 fine for a subsequent violation.
