Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That, by February 10, 2024, the Public Utilities
Commission shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and
Technology that includes the information gathered under section 1 and what methods the
commission considered under section 2, along with any recommendations. The committee
may report out a bill related to the report to the 131st Legislature in 2024.'

15 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment requires the Public 16 Utilities Commission to issue a request for information to competitive electricity providers 17 and standard-offer service providers. It also directs the commission to consider methods to 18 undertake to better educate electric consumers on their electric energy supply and the 19 factors that cause fluctuations in the cost of that supply. It also requires the commission to 20 identify and examine methods to calculate the levelized cost of electricity for each power 21 source that may be used in supplying energy to residential and small nonresidential 22 consumers. It requires, by February 10, 2024, the commission to submit a report, and it 23 allows the committee to report out a bill to the 131st Legislature in 2024.
