1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2122 is enacted to read:
3	§2122. Unattended child in a motor vehicle
4 5 6 7	1. Prohibition. A person who is a parent, guardian or other person legally charged with the care or custody of a minor who has not attained 10 years of age may not intentionally, knowingly or recklessly leave the minor unattended inside a motor vehicle under conditions that present a substantial health or safety risk to the minor.
8 9 10	<b>2. Penalties.</b> A violation of this section is a traffic infraction for which a fine of not more than \$50 for the first offense, not more than \$100 for the 2nd offense and not more than \$250 for the 3rd and subsequent offenses may be adjudged.

11 SUMMARY

 This bill prohibits a parent, guardian or other person legally charged with the care or custody of a minor who has not attained 10 years of age from intentionally, knowingly or recklessly leaving that minor in a motor vehicle under conditions that present a substantial health or safety risk to the minor. Violating this law is a traffic infraction for which a fine of not more than \$50 for the first offense, not more than \$100 for the 2nd offense and not more than \$250 for the 3rd and subsequent offenses may be adjudged.
