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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 82, L.D. 136

SUMMARY

2 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, amends the provision 3 of law governing the legal effect of an order entered in a child protection proceeding, 4 including a preliminary protection order, to clarify that such an order generally takes 5 precedence over any other order regarding the child's care or custody, even if the other 6 order was entered after the preliminary protection order. It also clarifies that this general 7 rule does not limit the authority of the District Court to determine parentage during the 8 pendency of a child protection proceeding, to consolidate a child protection proceeding 9 with another matter or to resolve a child protection proceeding through the entry of a 10 parental rights and responsibilities order, a guardianship order or an adoption order. 11 The amendment also makes technical changes to the bill, including by replacing the 12 word "paternity" with the word "parentage" to reflect the enactment of the Maine Parentage Act in Public Law 2015, chapter 296, which eliminated paternity proceedings and replaced 13 them with proceedings to adjudicate parentage. 14 15 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED 16 (See attached)
