Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 22 MRSA c. 1629 is enacted to read:
<u>CHAPTER 1629</u>
WAITING LIST AND ASSESSMENTS FOR HOME CARE SERVICES
§7411. Public information regarding certain home care services
1. Definition. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, "individuals eligible for home care services" means:
A. Individuals who are elderly or disabled and whom the department determines are eligible for care provided in a nursing facility setting in accordance with the procedures described in section 3174-I, but for whom care can be appropriately provided in the individual's home or other residential community setting under a waiver granted by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for home-based and community-based care and who choose to receive care in the individual's home or other residential community setting; or
B. Individuals whom the department determines are eligible for private duty nursing and personal care services provided in a residential setting or other setting where normal life activities take place.
2. Waiting list established. The department shall establish and maintain a waiting list of individuals eligible for home care services.
3. Publicly available information. The department shall publish on its publicly accessible website the following real-time data relating to the waiting list established pursuant to subsection 2, including the number of:
A. Individuals eligible for home care services who are fully served;
B. Individuals eligible for home care services who are partially served and the number of unstaffed hours for those individuals;
<u>C.</u> Individuals eligible for home care services who are waiting for services and the number of unstaffed hours for those individuals;
D. Days, on average, individuals eligible for home care services wait to receive services; and
E. Individuals eligible for home care services, broken down by county, who are fully served and partially served.
4. Annual report. Beginning February 1, 2024 and annually thereafter, the department shall submit to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters a report on the waiting list of individuals eligible for home care services established in accordance with this section. The report must include the department's plans to clear the waiting list and ensure that individuals eligible for home care services are receiving services for all the hours for which they are eligible.

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§7412. Assessments for children eligible for home care services

Beginning January 15, 2024, the department shall contract with a 3rd-party entity,
including but not limited to an assessment services agency that determines eligibility for
programs and services, to conduct assessments for children who have not attained 21 years
of age who the department determines are eligible for private duty nursing and personal
care services provided in a residential setting or other setting where normal life activities
take place.

8 Sec. 4. Waiting list and publicly available information. In accordance with 9 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, chapter 1629, the Department of Health and Human 10 Services shall, no later than January 15, 2024, establish a waiting list of MaineCare 11 members eligible for home care services under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits 12 Manual, Chapters II and III, Section 19, Home and Community Benefits for the Elderly 13 and Adults with Disabilities, and Section 96, Private Duty Nursing and Personal Care 14 Services.

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SUMMARY

16 This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to establish a waiting 17 list of individuals eligible for home care services under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare 18 Benefits Manual, Chapters II and III, Section 19, Home and Community Benefits for the 19 Elderly and Adults with Disabilities, and Section 96, Private Duty Nursing and Personal 20 Care Services, and to publish certain information about the waiting list on its publicly 21 accessible website. It requires the department to submit an annual report to the joint 22 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services 23 matters relating to the waiting list.

The bill requires the department to contract with a 3rd-party entity to conduct assessments for children who have not attained 21 years of age who the department determines are eligible for private duty nursing and personal care services provided in a residential setting or other setting where normal life activities take place.
