Sec. 1. Maine Board of Pharmacy study. Resolved: That the Maine Board of Pharmacy shall conduct a study to review the work practices and treatment of pharmacists, including, but not limited to, treatment by employers.

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, by December 6, 2023, the Maine Board of Pharmacy shall submit a report based on its study in section 1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services. The Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services may report out a bill based on the subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

10 SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Maine Board of Pharmacy to conduct a study to review the work practices and treatment of pharmacists, including, but not limited to, treatment by employers. The board is required to submit a report based on its study by December 6, 2023 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services, which may report out a bill based on the subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.
