11 12	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting the following:
13 14	'Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §3106, as amended by PL 2009, c. 501, §3, is further amended to read:
15 16	§3106. Municipal assistance for purposes of protecting or restoring a great pond natural resources
17 18 19 20 21	1. Repairs to a private road Protection or restoration of great ponds through repairs to private roads, ways or bridges. For the purpose of protecting or restoring a great pond, as defined in Title 38, section 480-B, subsection 5, a municipality may appropriate funds to repair a private road, way or bridge to prevent storm water runoff pollution from reaching a great pond if:
22	A. The private road, way or bridge is within the watershed of the great pond;
23	B. The great pond:
24 25	(1) Is listed on the Department of Environmental Protection's list of bodies of water most at risk pursuant to Title 38, section 420-D, subsection 3;
26 27 28 29	(2) Has been listed as impaired in an integrated water quality monitoring and assessment report submitted by the Department of Environmental Protection to the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to the federal Clean Water Act, 33 United States Code, Section 1315(b) at least once since 2002; or
30 31	(3) Is identified as having threats to water quality in a completed watershed survey that uses a protocol accepted by the Department of Environmental Protection;
32 33	C. The Department of Environmental Protection or the municipality determines that the private road, way or bridge is contributing to the degradation of the water quality

6	"Regional community and economic development organization" includes, but is not
7	limited to, the Midcoast Regional Redevelopment Authority established in Title 5,
8	section 13083-G.
9	2. Rules. The Department of Environmental Protection may adopt rules to carry out
0	the purposes of this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical
-1	rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.'
