An Act to Include a Tribal Member in the Baxter State Park Authority

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## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

**Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §901, first ¶**, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. B, §56; PL 2011, c. 657, Pt. W, §7; and PL 2013, c. 405, Pt. A, §23, is further amended to read:

4 All the lands in Townships 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, Range 9 W.E.L.S. and in Townships 3, 4, 5 5 and 6, Range 10 W.E.L.S., Piscataquis County, and Township 6, Range 8 W.E.L.S., 6 Penobscot County, that have been donated and conveyed to the State in trust by Percival Proctor Baxter and all lands in the Townships 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, Range 9 and in Townships 7 8 3, 4, 5 and 6, Range 10, and in Township 6, Range 8 and all lands in Piscataguis and 9 Penobscot Counties that hereafter shall be are donated and conveyed to the State by Percival Proctor Baxter in trust for state forest, public park and public recreational purposes 10 are named and shall are hereafter be named "Baxter State Park" in honor of the donor, and 11 12 the same hereafter shall must forever be so designated on the official maps and records of 13 the State. They shall be are under the joint supervision and control of, and shall must be 14 administered by the Director of the Bureau of Forestry, the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and, the Attorney General and one member of a federally recognized 15 16 Indian nation, tribe or band in this State, and the commissioner, director and, Attorney 17 General shall and member of a federally recognized Indian nation, tribe or band in this 18 State have full power in the control and management of the same, under the title of Baxter 19 State Park Authority, as authorized by Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 11. The 20 Governor shall select the member who is a member of a federally recognized Indian nation, 21 tribe or band in this State based on the joint recommendation of the tribal governments of 22 the Aroostook Band of Micmacs, the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians, the 23 Passamaguoddy Tribe at Motahkomikuk, the Passamaguoddy Tribe at Sipayik and the 24 Penobscot Nation. If the tribal governments do not make a unanimous joint 25 recommendation, the Governor shall appoint a member of a federally recognized Indian 26 nation, tribe or band in this State and rotate the appointment among members of each 27 federally recognized Indian nation, tribe or band in this State. The member of a federally recognized Indian nation, tribe or band in this State serves a 4-year term. The authority 28 29 shall receive moneys money available from trust funds established by the donor of the park 30 and shall include fees collected, income from park trust funds invested by the Treasurer of 31 State and other miscellaneous income derived from the park for maintenance and operation 32 of the park.

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## SUMMARY

This bill adds one member of a federally recognized Indian nation, tribe or band in this State to the Baxter State Park Authority, which has full power in the control and management of Baxter State Park.
