COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 132, L.D. 311, "An Act to Amend
10 Certain Laws Governing Pari-Mutuel Pools on Harness Racing"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

12

**'An Act to Delay the Repeal of the Law Governing the Sale of Pari-Mutuel Pools for
13 Simulcast Harness Racing'**

14

Amend the bill in the emergency preamble in the 2nd paragraph in the first and 2nd
15 lines (page 1, lines 3 and 4 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "amends certain
16 provisions of law governing harness racing, including clarifying the regulation of" and
17 inserting the following: 'delays the repeal of the provision of law governing'

18

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1.

19

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section
20 number to read consecutively.

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, removes the definition
23 of "enclosure" from the bill.
