A graduated enforcement plan for violations of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter that provides for enforcement actions that are proportional to the 15 seriousness of the violation and reasonable in comparison to similar violations in the 16 State's alcohol industry, including, but not limited to, warnings, plans of correction, 17 fines and suspensions and revocations. The department shall establish a process to 18 19 solicit input in the development of the enforcement plan under this paragraph from caregivers, registered caregivers, dispensaries and qualifying patients with significant 20 21 knowledge of and experience in the medical use of cannabis. The department shall publish the enforcement plan and inspection requirements under section 2430-G, 22 23 subsection 2 in a manner that is easily available to the public, including in an online 24 format. 25 **SUMMARY** 26 This bill directs the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to adopt 27 major substantive rules to develop a graduated enforcement plan for violations of the Maine 28 Medical Use of Cannabis Act or rules adopted under the Act, to include a stakeholder 29 process in the adoption of those rules and to make the enforcement plan publicly available.
