COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 226, L.D. 375, "Resolve, Regarding Legislative Review of Portions of Chapter 570: Uniform Reporting System for Prescription Drug Price Data Sets, a Major Substantive Rule of the Maine Health Data Organization"

Amend the resolve in section 1 in the last line (page 1, line 18 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "authorized" the following: 'only if the rule is amended in Section 2(C)(1)(a) to correct the cross-reference'
