COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 183, L.D. 402, "An Act to Change  
Maine's Transportation Laws"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'Resolve, to Rename a Bridge in the Town of Limerick the Sokokis Lake Veterans  
Memorial Bridge'**

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

**'Sec. 1. Bridge in Limerick renamed. Resolved:** That the Department of  
Transportation shall designate Bridge 3157, located on Route 11 in the Town of Limerick,  
currently known as the Sokokis Lake Bridge, the Sokokis Lake Veterans Memorial Bridge.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section  
number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft, with a resolve. The  
amendment directs the Department of Transportation to designate Bridge 3157 on Route  
11 in the Town of Limerick the Sokokis Lake Veterans Memorial Bridge.
