4 5 6 7 8	4. Exemption. Hard cider is and nonalcoholic carbonated cider labeled as "sparkling cider" are exempt from this section. For purposes of this subsection, "hard cider" means liquor produced by fermentation of the juice of apples or pears, including, but not limited to, flavored, sparkling or carbonated cider, that contains not less than 1/2 of 1% alcohol by volume and "liquor" has the same meaning as in Title 28-A, section 2, subsection 16.

10 11	This bill exempts nonalcoholic carbonated cider labeled as "sparkling cider" from restrictions on products labeled as cider.
