HOUSE AMENDMENT " C " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 257,  
L.D. 424, "An Act Making Certain Appropriations and Allocations and Changing Certain  
Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government"

Amend the amendment by inserting after Part T the following:

**'PART U**

**Sec. U-1. Legislative intent regarding structural income tax relief.** It is the  
intent of the Legislature that the budget next enacted after enactment of this Act by the  
131st Legislature affecting the 2024-2025 biennium must include structural individual  
income tax relief that primarily benefits low-income and middle-income individuals and  
families beginning in tax year 2024 with a 2024-2025 General Fund biennial cost equal to  
\$200,000,000.

**PART V**

**Sec. V-1. Public assistance reform working group.** In order to strengthen and  
enhance the State's workforce participation, the Governor shall convene a working group  
to evaluate the State's unemployment compensation system and the Temporary Assistance  
to Needy Families program, the MaineCare program, the general assistance program and  
the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for effectiveness, misuse and redundancy  
to inform deliberations on the budget next enacted by the 131st Legislature. The Governor  
shall submit the findings and recommendations of the working group's deliberations to the  
Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs no later than May 15,  
2023.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or  
section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment states that the Legislature intends, in the budget next enacted after  
this Act, to implement income tax relief that benefits low-income and middle-income  
individuals and families beginning in tax year 2024 at a cost of \$200,000,000 for the 2024-  
2025 biennium.

1           The amendment also requires the Governor to convene a working group to evaluate the  
 2 State's unemployment compensation system and the Temporary Assistance to Needy  
 3 Families program, the MaineCare program, the general assistance program and the  
 4 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for effectiveness, misuse and redundancy and  
 5 provide a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs  
 6 to inform deliberations on the budget next enacted by the 131st Legislature.
