It is the intent of the Legislature that the budget next enacted after enactment of this Act by the 131st Legislature affecting the 2024-2025 biennium must include structural individual income tax relief that primarily benefits low-income and middle-income individuals and families beginning in tax year 2024 with a 2024-2025 General Fund biennial cost equal to \$200,000,000.

In order to strengthen and enhance the State's workforce participation, the Governor shall convene a working group to evaluate the State's unemployment compensation system and the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program, the MaineCare program, the general assistance program and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for effectiveness, misuse and redundancy to inform deliberations on the budget next enacted by the 131st Legislature.
