| 4  | The Chief Medical Examiner may authorize any other expenses necessary to carry out                          |
| 5  | the Chief Medical Examiner's duties. The Chief Medical Examiner shall reimburse a                           |
| 6  | funeral establishment that transports a body to Augusta at the request of the Office of Chief               |
| 7  | Medical Examiner at the following rates: for up to and including the first 25 miles, \$120                  |
| 8  | <u>\$300;</u> for the next 25 miles, $\frac{2}{4.50}$ per mile traveled while actually transporting a body; |
| 9  | and for miles in excess of 50, $\frac{1.75}{4}$ per mile traveled while actually transporting a body.       |
| 10 | If an employee of a funeral establishment is required to wait at the Office of Chief Medical                |
| 11 | Examiner due to processes or other official activities of the Chief Medical Examiner, the                   |
| 12 | Chief Medical Examiner shall reimburse the funeral establishment at a rate equal to the                     |
| 13 | wage rate in Title 26, section 664, subsection 1 for the period of time the employee waits.                 |
