An Act to Allow Armed Security in Schools

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1005 is enacted to read:

#### 3 §1005. Armed security

A school board may employ or engage by contract a school resource officer, private contractor or volunteer with applicable background and experience to provide armed security at a school within the school board's school administrative unit. The school board may establish qualifications and wage rates for any security personnel employed or engaged under this section. For purposes of this section, "school resource officer" has the same meaning as in section 6556.

#### 10 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §6552, sub-§2, ¶D is enacted to read:

- 11D. The prohibition on possession and discharge of a firearm does not apply to a person12employed or engaged by a school board to provide security for a school in the school
- 13 board's school administrative unit under section 1005.

### 14 SUMMARY

15 This bill allows a school board to employ or engage by contract a school resource 16 officer, private contractor or volunteer with applicable background and experience to 17 provide armed security at a school within the school board's school administrative unit.
