An Act to Retain Home and Community-based Workers by Increasing MaineCare Reimbursement for Certain Essential Support Workers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §7402, sub-§1,** as enacted by PL 2021, c. 398, Pt. AAAA, §1, is amended to read:
- 1. At least 125% of the minimum wage. An amount equal to at least 125% of the minimum wage established in Title 26, section 664, subsection 1 for the labor portion of the reimbursement rate. An increase to the minimum wage must be applied to the reimbursement rate at the time the increase takes place. Additionally, the department shall annually adjust its reimbursement rates for services provided by essential support workers in municipalities where the local minimum wage exceeds 125% of the state minimum wage to ensure that the labor portion of reimbursement is increased by the amount by which a municipality's local minimum wage exceeds 125% of the state minimum wage; and

This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to annually adjust its reimbursement rates for home and community-based services provided by essential support workers in municipalities where the local minimum wage exceeds 125% of the state minimum wage to ensure that that the labor portion of reimbursement is increased by the amount by which a municipality's local minimum wage exceeds 125% of the state minimum wage.
