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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to SP 255, LD 587, "Resolve, to Automatically Increase a Residential Care or Nursing Facility Resident's Personal Needs Allowance Under the MaineCare Program When the Consumer Price Index Increases"

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Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting the following

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'Resolve, to Increase Residential Care and Nursing Facility Residents' Personal Needs Allowances Under the MaineCare Program'

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Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following

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'Sec. 1. Personal needs allowance for residents of nursing facilities.

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Resolved: That, by January 1, 2025, the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend the rules for the MaineCare program to increase the personal needs allowance for persons residing in nursing facilities. The rules must provide for an increase in the personal needs allowance to \$70 per month. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

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Sec. 2. Personal needs allowance for residents of residential care facilities.

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Resolved: That, by January 1, 2025, the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend the rules for the MaineCare program to increase the personal needs allowance for persons residing in residential care facilities. The rules must provide for an increase in the personal needs allowance to \$100 per month. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

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Sec. 3. Cost-of-living increases. Resolved: That the Department of Health and

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Human Services shall apply a cost-of-living increase to the personal needs allowance for persons residing in nursing facilities or residential care facilities under the rules for the MaineCare program on an annual basis. The inflation-adjusted cost-of-living percentage change must be made in accordance with the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index. The personal needs allowance may not be reduced if the cost-of-living change for a year is negative.

Federal Expenditures Fund allocations are also included for the FMAP match.
