RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Establish a Right to Health Care

Constitutional amendment. Resolved: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

Constitution, Art. I, §26 is enacted to read:

Section 26. Right to health care. Health care, including care to prevent and treat physical and mental illness, is the right of the people and necessary to ensure the strength of the State. The Legislature shall provide by law the implementation and enforcement of this right, which may not be infringed upon.

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to establish that health care, including care to prevent and treat physical and mental illness, is the right of the people and necessary to ensure the strength of the State and to require the Legislature to provide by law the implementation and enforcement of this right?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

31 SUMMARY

This resolution proposes a constitutional amendment to establish that health care, including care to prevent and treat physical and mental illness, is the right of the people and necessary to ensure the strength of the State and requires the Legislature to provide by law the implementation and enforcement of this right.
