1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §85, sub-§9 is enacted to read:
3	9. COVID-19 vaccination. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an
4	emergency medical services person licensed under this chapter employed by or serving as
5	a volunteer for a municipality may respond and provide treatment within the scope of the
6	person's license without having been vaccinated against the virus that causes coronavirus
7	disease 2019, also known as COVID-19, or the influenza virus.
8	SUMMARY
9	This bill allows emergency medical services persons to provide treatment within the
10	scope of their licenses without having been vaccinated against the COVID-19 virus or the
11	influenza virus.
