COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 397, L.D. 620, "An Act to Promote Free Trade by Preventing Municipalities from Prohibiting the Sale of Legal Goods"

Amend the bill in section 1 in sub-c. 9 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 4 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "RESTRICTIONS ON THE SALE OF GOODS AND SERVICES" and inserting the following: 'LIMITS ON ECONOMIC REGULATION'

Amend the bill in section 1 in sub-c. 9 in §3991 in the first line (page 1, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Restrictions" and inserting the following: 'Sale of legal goods and services; restrictions'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
