2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §610-B, sub-§2-A,</b> as enacted by PL 2009, c. 209, §4, is amended to read:
4 5 6 7 8	<b>2-A.</b> Voluntary, technology-forcing emission standard. An outdoor wood boiler meeting a particulate matter emission limit of 0.06 0.32 pounds per million British Thermal Units heat output is not subject to a setback requirement as long as it meets the stack height requirements for an outdoor wood boiler meeting the emission standard in subsection 2 in accordance with rules adopted by the department.
9	Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §610-B, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
10 11 12	5. Rules. The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
13 14	A. Notwithstanding section 592-A, the rules must include a definition of "nuisance condition" specifically relating to the operation of outdoor wood boilers.
15 16 17 18	B. The rules may not prohibit the emission of a smoke plume from an outdoor wood boiler, regardless of whether such emission remains upon the property of the owner of the outdoor wood boiler or crosses onto any adjacent land or buildings not owned by the owner.
19	<b>Sec. 3. 38 MRSA §610-B, first</b> ¶, as enacted by PL 2007, c. 442, §2, is repealed.
20	SUMMARY
21 22	This bill amends the law regulating outdoor wood boilers, which include outdoor pellet boilers, as follows.
23 24 25 26	1. It allows an outdoor wood boiler meeting a particulate matter emission limit of 0.32 pounds per million British Thermal Units heat output to be exempt from property setback requirements as long as it meets applicable stack height requirements under Department of Environmental Protection rules.
27 28 29 30	2. It prohibits the department from adopting rules applicable to outdoor wood boilers that prohibit the emission of a smoke plume from an outdoor wood boiler, regardless of whether such emission remains upon the property of the owner of the outdoor wood boiler or crosses onto any adjacent land or buildings not owned by the owner.
