2	<b>Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §9325, sub-§2, ¶A,</b> as enacted by PL 1991, c. 36, §4, is amended to read:
4 5	A. Recreational campfires Any burning or fire under subsection 1 kindled when the ground is covered by snow or on frozen bodies of water;
5	SUMMARY
7 8 9	Current law requires a permit for certain types of burning and fires. This bill exempts those types of burning and fires from needing a permit if kindled on ground covered by snow or on frozen bodies of water.
