Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §354, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2019, c. 371, §11, is further
 amended to read:

4 1. Content. A nomination petition must contain the name of only one candidate, the 5 candidate's place of residence, the office sought and electoral division. A nomination petition may contain as many separate papers as necessary and may contain the candidate's 6 consent required by section 355. It may also contain the candidate's political designation-7 8 This designation may not exceed 3 words in length, may not incorporate the candidate's 9 name or the designation or an abbreviation of the designation of a party that is qualified to nominate candidates by primary election and may not consist of or comprise language that 10 is obscene, contemptuous, profane or prejudicial, promotes abusive or unlawful activity or 11 violates any other provision of the laws of this State with respect to names. as either 12 "unenrolled" or "no party designation." A candidate who intends to form a new party about 13 that person's candidacy must use the proposed party's designation. 14

- A. When 2 United States Senators are to be nominated, the nomination petition must
 contain the term of office sought by the candidate.
- B. The names of presidential electors must be placed on the petition as a slate. The
 names of the candidates for President and Vice President must be placed on a petition
 for the nomination of presidential electors.
 - SUMMARY

This bill removes the ability for a candidate seeking nomination by petition to select a political designation according to specific guidelines and instead allows a candidate seeking nomination by petition to select either "unenrolled" or "no party designation."
