**An Act to Prevent Electioneering on General Election Ballots by  
Candidates Nominated by Petition**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §354, sub-§1**, as amended by PL 2019, c. 371, §11, is further  
3 amended to read:

4 **1. Content.** A nomination petition must contain the name of only one candidate, the  
5 candidate's place of residence, the office sought and electoral division. A nomination  
6 petition may contain as many separate papers as necessary and may contain the candidate's  
7 consent required by section 355. It may also contain the candidate's political designation.  
8 ~~This designation may not exceed 3 words in length, may not incorporate the candidate's~~  
9 ~~name or the designation or an abbreviation of the designation of a party that is qualified to~~  
10 ~~nominate candidates by primary election and may not consist of or comprise language that~~  
11 ~~is obscene, contemptuous, profane or prejudicial, promotes abusive or unlawful activity or~~  
12 ~~violates any other provision of the laws of this State with respect to names. as either~~  
13 "unenrolled" or "no party designation." A candidate who intends to form a new party about  
14 that person's candidacy must use the proposed party's designation.

15 A. When 2 United States Senators are to be nominated, the nomination petition must  
16 contain the term of office sought by the candidate.

17 B. The names of presidential electors must be placed on the petition as a slate. The  
18 names of the candidates for President and Vice President must be placed on a petition  
19 for the nomination of presidential electors.

20 **SUMMARY**

21 This bill removes the ability for a candidate seeking nomination by petition to select a  
22 political designation according to specific guidelines and instead allows a candidate  
23 seeking nomination by petition to select either "unenrolled" or "no party designation."
