An Act to Prohibit Off-trail Operation of a Snowmobile in an Area Closed to Off-trail Operation

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §13106-A, sub-§27 is enacted to read:

27. Operating snowmobile in posted area. A person may not operate a snowmobile off a snowmobile trail in an area that is posted as being closed to off-trail snowmobile operation.

A. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 may be adjudged.

B. A person who violates this subsection after having been adjudicated as having committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within the previous 5-year period commits a Class E crime.

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits a person from operating a snowmobile off a snowmobile trail in an area that is posted as being closed to off-trail snowmobile operation. It provides for a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 for the first violation of the prohibition and that a violation after 3 or more civil violations of the inland fisheries and wildlife laws is a Class E crime.
