1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §600-B** is enacted to read:

3 **§600-B. Training repayment agreement prohibited**

4 **1. Training costs.** An employer may not require an employee to enter into an
5 agreement that requires the employee to financially reimburse the employer for training
6 costs related to the employment incurred by that employer if the employee leaves
7 employment with that employer.

8 **2. Enforcement.** The Department of Labor shall enforce this section.

9 **SUMMARY**

10 This bill specifies that an employer may not require an employee to enter into an
11 agreement that requires the employee to reimburse the employer for training costs related
12 to the employment if the employee leaves employment with that employer. The
13 Department of Labor is required to enforce this provision.
