| 25 26 27 28 29 | This amendment, which is a minority report of the committee, changes the title of the bill and prohibits a candidate from attending a voting place except for the purpose of voting A candidate who attends a voting place for the purpose of voting may, as provided in current law, orally communicate with voters as long as the candidate does not attempt to influence their vote or state the name of the office sought or request a person's vote |
