COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “A” to S P 326, L D 767, “An Act to Provide Uniform Protections from Retaliation for Maine Workers in Connection with the Exercise of Rights Protected Under the Laws Governing Employment Practices”

Amend the bill in section 1 in sub-c 1-D in §620 by inserting after the first indented paragraph the following

'This section may not be construed to limit or restrict the rights of an individual to seek other available remedies in a separate legal action '

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively

This amendment specifies that the language in the bill may not be construed to limit or restrict the rights of an individual to seek other available remedies in a separate legal action
