Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission has the following duties

1 Examine actions taken in other states that have legalized cannabis use to address the banking needs of individuals and businesses involved in the cannabis industry,

2 Evaluate proposals to address the issues under subsection 1 at the federal level and opportunities to advocate for federal action,

3 Examine barriers and costs to the cannabis industry for banking services compared to other businesses and consider ways to reduce unnecessary barriers and costs,

The amendment establishes the Commission to Review and Develop Options for Meeting the Banking Needs of the Cannabis Industry The commission has 9 legislative members, including members who serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services, the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation The commission is directed to review options for meeting the banking needs of individuals and businesses involved in the adult use cannabis and medical cannabis industries in the State The commission is required to submit a report based on the review by January 15, 2024 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services, which is authorized to submit legislation based on the report to the 131st Legislature in 2024

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$6,550 in fiscal year 2023-24 The Legislature's proposed budget for the 2024-2025 biennium includes \$14,500 in each of fiscal years 2023-24 and 2024-25 for the costs of legislative studies, as well as \$2,234 in projected balances from fiscal year 2022-23 and \$36,777 of balances carried over from prior years for this purpose Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend o the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources
