- 1 It directs the Department of Public Safety, Maine Drug Enforcement Agency to form a stakeholder group to study whether the drug tianeptine should be added to the list of scheduled drugs under the Maine Criminal Code and, if so, at which level the drug should be scheduled
- 2 It requires members of the stakeholder group to include representatives of the Department of Health and Human Services, the judicial branch, a statewide association representing prosecutors, a statewide association representing criminal defense attorneys and others.
- 3 It directs the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency to report the findings and recommendations of the stakeholder group, including any recommended legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety by February 1, 2024 The committee is authorized to report out a bill related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature
