An Act to Prohibit Persons Who Donate to a Governor's Transition Committee and Inaugural Committee from Registering as Lobbyists

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §318-A, as enacted by PL 2013, c. 288, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§318-A. Prohibitions

- 1. Previous employment. A person may not register as a lobbyist or lobbyist associate or engage in activities that require registration as a lobbyist or lobbyist associate as defined by section 312-A, subsections 10 and 10-A, respectively, if that person has within the previous 12 months been employed in a position for which the salary is subject to adjustment by the Governor under Title 2, section 6 or that is described as a major policy-influencing position under Title 5, chapter 71. A person who violates this subsection may be assessed a fine of \$100 for every day the person engages in lobbying.
- 2. Contribution to transition committee or inaugural committee or expenses. A person may not register as a lobbyist or lobbyist associate or engage in activities that require registration as a lobbyist or lobbyist associate as defined in section 312-A, subsections 10 and 10-A, respectively, if that person has contributed to the transition committee or inaugural committee or expenses of a Governor-elect. The prohibition described in this subsection is in effect for the length of the term served by the Governor-elect as Governor. A person who violates this subsection may be assessed a fine of \$100 for every day the person engages in lobbying.

20 SUMMARY

This bill prohibits a person from registering as a lobbyist or lobbyist associate or engaging in activities that require registration as a lobbyist or lobbyist associate if the person has contributed to the transitional committee or inaugural committee or expenses of a Governor-elect. The prohibition is in effect for the length of the term served by the Governor-elect as Governor.
