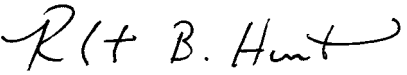

An Act to Require State Agencies to Complete the Rulemaking Process Within One Year of a Legislative Directive to Adopt Rules

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §8052, sub-§9 is enacted to read:

9. Timing of adoption. When an agency is directed by law to adopt rules, the agency shall adopt, or in the case of major substantive rules adopted under subchapter 2-A, shall provisionally adopt, all of those rules within 12 months of the effective date of the law, unless otherwise required or directed by law.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 2024.

SUMMARY

This bill provides that when an agency is directed by law to adopt rules, the agency, unless otherwise required or directed by law, must adopt, or in the case of major substantive rules adopted under subchapter 2-A, must provisionally adopt, all of those rules within 12 months of the effective date of the law.
