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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 543, L.D. 853

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 15, 2025, the department shall submit a report to the joint standing or joint select committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters with a proposed amendment to the Constitution of Maine establishing a right to housing that directs the Legislature to enact appropriate laws to execute the purposes of the amendment. The report must describe how the proposed constitutional amendment will ensure fair access to housing for all residents of the State and how unintended consequences may be avoided. The committee receiving the report is authorized to report out legislation to the 132nd Legislature in 2025.'

9 Amend the resolution by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or 10 section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

12 This amendment replaces the resolution with a resolve directing the Department of 13 Economic and Community Development to convene a stakeholder group to develop a 14 proposed amendment to the Constitution of Maine establishing a right to housing that also 15 directs the Legislature to enact appropriate laws to execute the amendment. The 16 department is required to submit a report with the proposed amendment to the joint standing 17 or joint select committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters no 18 later than January 15, 2025, and the committee is authorized to submit legislation to the 19 132nd Legislature in 2025,
