An Act to Prohibit State Contracts with Companies Owned or Operated by the Government of the People's Republic of China

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §2049 is enacted to read:
3 4	§2049. Contracts with certain companies affiliated with the government of the People's Republic of China prohibited
5 6	1. <b>Definitions.</b> As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
7 8 9	A. "Company" means any type of legal business entity recognized under the laws of the State, including any subsidiaries, parent companies or affiliates of the company that exists for the purposes of making a profit.
10	B. "Government of China" means the government of the People's Republic of China.
11 12	C. "Subject company" means a company that is owned or operated by the government of China.
13 14	2. Certification required. A company that submits a bid or proposal for a contract with the State for goods or services shall certify that the company is not a subject company
15 16 17	3. <b>Prohibition.</b> A subject company is ineligible for and may not bid on or submit a proposal, directly or indirectly, for a contract with a public or private entity that directly or indirectly receives state funding.
18 19 20	4. Civil violation; penalty. A company that submits a false certification under subsection 2 commits a civil violation for which a fine may be adjudged in an amount that is the greater of:
21	A. Twice the amount of the contract for which the bid or proposal was submitted; or
22	B. \$250,000.
23 24	The State shall terminate the contract with a company found to have violated subsection 2 and the company is subject to the prohibition in subsection 3.
25	SUMMARY
26 27 28 29 30 31	This bill requires that a company that submits a bid or proposal for a contract with the State for goods or services must certify that the company is not owned or operated by the government of the People's Republic of China. It provides that a company owned or operated by the government of the People's Republic of China is ineligible for and may not bid on or submit a proposal, directly or indirectly, for a contract with a public or private entity that directly or indirectly receives state funding.
