For purposes of this section, "state agency" means a state department, agency, office, board or commission or quasi-independent agency, board, commission, authority or institution.

15 16 17 18 19	This bill requires the judicial branch and all state departments, agencies, offices, boards and commissions and quasi-independent agencies, boards, commissions, authorities and institutions to include, by November 1, 2024, a space to designate "X" for gender in lieu of "male" or "female" on all forms, applications and documents printed or made available online that request a person to identify the person's gender.
