An Act Regarding Disabled Motor Vehicles on Public Ways

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2093 is enacted to read:
3	§2093. Disabled motor vehicles
4 5 6 7	1. Disabled motor vehicle. The operator of a motor vehicle that is disabled on a public way due to a malfunction of the motor vehicle shall activate the motor vehicle's hazard lights and, if available, place one or more external warning devices, including a warning triangle or flare, in position to alert an approaching motor vehicle.
8 9 10	2. Passing a disabled motor vehicle. The operator of a motor vehicle passing a disabled motor vehicle under subsection 1, with due regard to the safety and traffic conditions, shall:
11	A. Pass in a lane not adjacent to that of the disabled motor vehicle, if possible; or
12 13 14	B. If passing in a nonadjacent lane is impossible or unsafe, pass the disabled motor vehicle at a careful and prudent speed reasonable for passing the disabled motor vehicle safely.
15 16	3. Violation. A violation of subsection 2 is a traffic infraction for which a minimum fine of \$275 must be adjudged.
17	SUMMARY
18 19 20 21 22 23	This bill requires the operator of a disabled motor vehicle on a public way to activate the motor vehicle's hazard lights and place warning devices such as a warning triangle or flares, if available, in a position to alert approaching motor vehicles. The bill also requires an operator of a motor vehicle to pass a disabled motor vehicle in a lane not adjacent to the disabled motor vehicle or, if not possible or safe to pass in that nonadjacent lane, to pass the disabled motor vehicle safely at a careful and prudent speed.
