1 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively 3 **SUMMARY** 4 This amendment, which is the majority report, reduces the number of members on the 5 Maine Forest Advisory Board from 21 to 10 and requires the Governor to appoint all 6 members of the board The amendment also requires that at least one member of the board 7 be a professional forester The amendment revises the duties of the board to advise and 8 assist the Bureau of Forestry within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and 9 Forestry in the development and implementation of the state forest action plan required 10 under the federal Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 The amendment also requires the director of the bureau to submit to the Governor and the Legislature a decennial 11 12 report on the implementation of the state forest action plan, beginning January 1, 2025 13 This amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section 14 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill creates the Maine Forest Advisory Board to advise the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (ACF) regarding a variety of forestry issues and to provide input on the state forest action plan required under the federal Food, Conservation and Energy Act of 2008. The bill includes ongoing appropriations starting in fiscal year 2023-24 of \$5,130 to ACF for the reimbursement of board member expenses. While this bill does not include specific instructions for staffing to the board, ACF has indicated that if requested to provide staffing to the advisory board, the department may require additional funding of \$120,611 for one Senior Planner position, its associated costs and for the anticipated use of contracted facilitation services.

Additional costs to the University of Maine System associated with having a wildlife biologist representing the University of Maine participate on the advisory board can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources
