The owner of a firearm shall report the loss or theft of the firearm to a local law enforcement agency in the jurisdiction in which the loss or theft occurred within 72 hours of the time the owner knew that the firearm had been lost or stolen. This subsection does not apply to the loss or theft of an antique firearm, as defined in 18 United States Code, Section 921(a)(16) as in effect on June 25, 2022.

32 33 34	This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, replaces the bill. The amendment removes the language "or reasonably should have known" from the requirement to report a stolen firearm. The amendment also clarifies that a person commits
