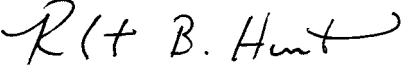

An Act Requiring the Reporting of Stolen Firearms

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §455-B** is enacted to read:

3 **§455-B. Reporting of stolen firearms**

4 **1. Requirement.** The owner of a firearm shall report the loss or theft of the firearm
5 to a local law enforcement agency in the jurisdiction in which the loss or theft occurred
6 within 72 hours of the time the owner knew or reasonably should have known that the
7 firearm had been lost or stolen. This subsection does not apply for the loss or theft of an
8 antique firearm, as defined in 18 United States Code, Section 921(a)(16) as in effect on
9 June 25, 2022.

10 **2. Civil penalties.** The following penalties apply to violations of this section.

11 A. A person who violates subsection 1 commits a civil violation for which a fine of
12 not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 may be adjudged.

13 B. A person who violates subsection 1 after having been adjudicated as having
14 committed 2 or more civil violations or for engaging in substantially similar conduct
15 to that contained in this subsection in another jurisdiction within the previous 10-year
16 period commits a Class E crime.

17 **SUMMARY**

18 This bill requires the owner of a firearm, except an antique firearm, to report the loss
19 or theft of the firearm to a local law enforcement agency.
