An Act to Expand the Higher Education Tuition Waiver for Persons Who Have Resided in Foster Care

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §12572, sub-§1,** as enacted by PL 1999, c. 216, §1, is amended to read:
- **1. Eligibility of person.** A person is eligible for a tuition waiver under this chapter if the person is:
 - A. A Is a Maine resident;

- B. A <u>Is a</u> high school graduate or has attained a high school equivalency diploma as described under section 257; and
- C. Accepted <u>Is accepted</u> for admission to a state postsecondary educational institution-; and
- D. Has entered into a voluntary extended care and support agreement with the Department of Health and Human Services under section 4037-A, if the person is eligible to enter into such an agreement.
- **Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §12572, sub-§4,** as enacted by PL 1999, c. 774, §3, is amended to read:
- **4. Revenue reduction.** A state postsecondary educational institution shall absorb the reduction in tuition revenues that results from providing a tuition waiver waivers to an 30 eligible person persons under this chapter. The institution may not request additional General Fund appropriations from the Legislature to offset the reduction in tuition revenues related to 30 tuition waivers. Twenty tuition waivers per year must be funded with General Fund appropriations.
- **Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §12573, sub-§3,** as amended by PL 2003, c. 187, §1, is further amended to read:
- **3. Limitation.** Tuition waivers to eligible persons are limited to 30 50 new students per year in each year at state postsecondary educational institutions as follows:
 - A. The first 25 tuition waivers must be available to eligible persons at the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine Community College System; and
 - B. Of the 5 The remaining tuition waivers, 3 must be available to eligible persons at the University of Maine System and 2 must be available to eligible persons at the Maine Community College System.

32 SUMMARY

This bill increases from 30 to 50 the number of tuition waivers for postsecondary education allowed to be granted each academic year to persons who, at the time of their graduation from high school or their successful completion of a general educational development examination, were in the custody of the Department of Health and Human Services and resided in foster care or subsidized adoptive care or were minor wards of a subsidized permanency guardian. The bill also makes necessary changes to the provisions regarding how the tuition waivers are apportioned to postsecondary educational institutions. The additional 20 waivers must be funded with General Fund appropriations. The bill also provides that students who are eligible to enter into a voluntary extended care

- and support agreement with the Department of Health and Human Services must enter into such an agreement to be eligible for a tuition waiver. 1 2
