Resolve, to Create the Commission to Study the Operations of the Maine Legislature

1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, this resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Operations of the 4 Maine Legislature; and 5 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next 6 legislative session; and 7 8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 9 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 10 11 therefore, be it 12 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the 13 Operations of the Maine Legislature, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is 14 established. Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 15 353, the commission consists of 12 members appointed as follows: 16 17 1. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature; 18 19 2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the 20 House, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats 21 in the Legislature; 22 3. Two members who are registered to lobby in the State, including one member appointed by the leaders of the party holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature 23 24 and one member appointed by the leaders of the party holding the 2nd largest number of 25 seats in the Legislature; 26 4. Two public members recommended by a statewide organization that represents local labor unions, appointed by the Governor; 27 28 5. Two public members recommended by a statewide organization that advocates for 29 the creation and preservation of jobs that create economic value or bring money into the State, appointed by the Governor; and 30 6. Two public members who represent the interests of small businesses and working 31 families, appointed by the Governor. 32 33 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the first-named public member recommended by a statewide organization that represents local labor unions 34 35 and the first-named public member recommended by a statewide organization that 36 advocates for the creation and preservation of jobs that create economic value or bring money into the State shall serve as cochairs of the commission. 37 38 Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all 39 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 40 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, 41

the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. If 30 days or more
after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been
made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for
the commission to meet and conduct its business.

5 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the existing structure 6 and operations of the Maine Legislature for the purposes of determining its adequacy and 7 effectiveness and identifying changes to the Legislature that could improve efficiency, 8 provide better information to inform decisions, help prioritize legislative activity and 9 reinforce political trust and support in State Government. In its work, the commission shall 10 consider, but is not limited to considering, the following elements:

- 11 1. The size of the Legislature;
- 12 2. The number of terms for members of the Legislature;
- 13 3. The frequency of elections for members of the Legislature;
- 14 4. The number of bills introduced each session;
- 15 5. The prioritization of legislation;
- 16 6. The roles and responsibilities of legislative leadership;
- 17 7. The determination of legislative districts during the reapportionment process;
- 18 8. The training and education of Legislators and legislative staff;
- 19 9. The committee assignment process;
- 20 10. The rules for testimony;

- 21 11. The use of policy research and data in the legislative process;
- 22 12. The process for transparency in the Legislature;
- 23 13. The adoption of a legislative strategic plan;
- 24 14. The inclusion of economic impact statements on legislation; and
  - 15. The process for forming and approving the state budget.

26 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide 27 necessary staffing services to the commission, except that Legislative Council staff support 28 is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session.

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, no later than December 6, 2023, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature. If the commission is unable to agree on all recommendations, the commission may issue both a majority report and a minority report.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation
 takes effect when approved.
