Resolve, to Establish a Pilot Project to Improve Access to Credit for Low-income Individuals

Sec. 1. Maine State Housing Authority to conduct 2-year rent payment reporting pilot project. Resolved: That the Maine State Housing Authority shall develop and administer through a contract with an appropriate vendor a 2-year pilot project to facilitate rent payment history reporting to credit reporting agencies for purposes of establishing or improving the credit ratings of low-income residential tenants through voluntary participation of residential landlords and tenants in the State in submitting rent payment histories of tenants. The project may not charge a fee to a landlord or a tenant for participation in the program. The Maine State Housing Authority shall seek to enroll as many residential tenants as possible who are persons of low income in the State and who broadly represent the various regions of the State, including urban, suburban and rural areas. For purposes of this section, "persons of low income" has the same meaning as in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 4702, subsection 12.

Sec. 2. Maine State Housing Authority to issue a request for proposals.

Resolved: That the Maine State Housing Authority shall issue a request for proposals for a vendor to provide an automated subscription-based service to collect, process and submit to appropriate credit reporting agencies rent payment histories collected under the pilot project described in section 1. The request for proposals must favor proposals that provide value in services delivered per unit cost, equity and impartiality in its processes, compliance with federal and state laws and privacy protections for pilot project participants.

- **Sec. 3. Report. Resolved:** That by December 3, 2025, the Maine State Housing Authority shall submit a report on the pilot project detailing the effectiveness of collecting and reporting rent payment histories and analysis of any improvement in the credit ratings of tenant participants along with any recommended legislation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor and housing. The joint standing committee may report out legislation based upon the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.
- **Sec. 4. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved:** That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Maine State Housing Authority to implement and administer a 2-year pilot project to collect and report tenant rent payment histories to appropriate credit reporting agencies with the purpose of improving the credit ratings of low-income residential tenants. The resolve includes a one-time appropriation of \$250,000 to contract with a vendor and pay subscription costs to implement and administer the project.
