An Act to Provide Rural Sober Living Housing for Mothers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §20058 is enacted to read:
§20058. Rural recovery residences for mothers and children
1. Recovery residences for mothers and children. The Maine State Housing Authority shall contract for the construction of at least 15 housing units in certified recovery residences under section 20057 that provide services to mothers recovering from substance use disorder and their minor children.
2. Location. The certified recovery residences contracted under this section must be located in counties with a county seat of no more than 35,000 residents and must be in close proximity to public transportation or provide transportation to residents of the certified recovery residences.
3. Services. A certified recovery residence must provide the following:
A. A central shared living and meeting space;
B. Recovery support services based on the needs of each resident; and
<u>C.</u> Support for reunification services with minor children based on the needs of each resident.
4. Staffing. Each certified recovery residence contracted under this section must be staffed by peer-to-peer staff, who must be paid at least livable wages, as defined in Title 26, section 1-A.
5. Fund. The Rural Recovery Residence Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund to receive funds to support the activities described in this section. The Maine State Housing Authority shall distribute funds through a competitive bid process to grantees, who will provide a minimum of 1:1 matching funds.
SUMMARY
This bill requires the Maine State Housing Authority to contract for the construction of at least 15 housing units, to be located in certified recovery residences and in counties with a county seat of no more than 35,000 residents. The certified recovery residences are required to serve mothers recovering from substance use disorder and promote reunification with minor children and are required to be staffed with peer-to-peer staff. The bill establishes the Rural Recovery Residence Fund to receive funds to support the certified recovery residences. The bill requires that the Maine State Housing Authority distribute funds through a competitive bid process to grantees, who will provide a minimum of 1:1 matching funds.
