'Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made

Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention 0143**

Initiative Provides one-time funding for the State's free health clinics, which are health care facilities or programs designed to provide primary medical care to medically underserved populations, particularly those who are uninsured or who have high deductible insurance plans. The funding is to be distributed based on a formula adopted by the Department of Health and Human Services using the number of clients served and a base amount for each clinic.
