Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §572 is enacted to read:

§572. Workplace health and safety grant program

- 1. Workplace health and safety grant program. The Department of Labor shall administer a grant program to issue grants of up to \$5,000 to employers in the State to make health and safety improvements at workplaces with 15 or fewer full-time employees. The department shall also provide resources to obtain health-related and safety-related equipment and training that support healthy and safe work environments and reduce the risk of injury and illness to workers.
- 2. Workplace Health and Safety Grant Fund. The Workplace Health and Safety Grant Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established and administered by the Department of Labor. The fund's purpose is to provide funds to carry out the grant program in subsection 1. The fund may receive funds from appropriations, allocations, donations, grants and other public or private sources. The fund is interest-bearing and interest generated by the fund must be credited to the fund. Funds in the fund at the end of the fiscal year do not lapse but must carry over to the next fiscal year. The department may pay from the fund reasonable department expenses in administering the fund.
- <u>3. Rules.</u> The Department of Labor shall adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this section. Rules adopted under this subsection are routine technical rules under Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

This bill requires the Department of Labor to administer a grant program and fund that provides up to \$5,000 for employers to pay for health and safety improvements at workplaces with 15 or fewer full-time employees and to provide resources to obtain health-related and safety-related equipment and training.
