COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S P 499, L D 1218, "An Act Establishing a System to Appeal Administrative Actions or Management Plans of the Bureau of Parks and Lands"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following

'Resolve, to Establish a Stakeholder Group to Examine Issues Relating to Leases of Land Managed by the Bureau of Parks and Lands'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following

'Sec. 1. Stakeholder group regarding leases on public lands. Resolved: That the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall convene a group of stakeholders, referred to in this resolve as "the stakeholder group," to examine issues relating to leases of land managed by the bureau The director shall invite the following to participate as members of the stakeholder group

1 Three representatives of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry

A One member from the Bureau of Parks and Lands,

B One member from the Bureau of Forestry, and

C One member from the Bureau of Resource Information and Land Use Planning,

2 A representative of the Maine Sporting Camp Association or similar statewide organization,

3 A representative of the Sportsman's Alliance of Maine or similar statewide organization,

4 A registered Maine guide, and

5 A local official from a municipality or an unorganized territory with public lands within the boundaries of the municipality or the unorganized territory

Sec. 2. Duties. Resolved: That the stakeholder group shall examine

1 Appeals to administrative actions made by the Department of Agriculture,
2 Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands regarding leases of or easements
3 held on land managed by the bureau and management plans adopted or updated by the
4 bureau, and

5 2 Rights to which a holder of a lease of or an easement on public land managed by
6 the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Parks and Lands is
7 entitled

8 **Sec. 3. Staffing and funding. Resolved:** That the Department of Agriculture,
9 Conservation and Forestry shall provide staff support to the stakeholder group from
10 existing resources The Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may use
11 contributions of money, services and supplies accepted under existing authority to support
12 the work of the stakeholder group

13 **Sec. 4. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than March 1, 2024, the Director of the
14 Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and
15 Forestry shall submit a report on the examination under section 2 that includes the findings
16 and recommendations of the stakeholder group, including suggested legislation, to the Joint
17 Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, which may report out a
18 bill based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature '

19 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section
20 number to read consecutively

21 **SUMMARY**

22 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill, which
23 is a concept draft, with a resolve The amendment requires the Director of the Bureau of
24 Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to
25 convene a group of 7 stakeholders to examine issues relating to leases of land managed by
26 the bureau No later than March 1, 2024, the director must submit a report, including
27 suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and
28 Forestry, which may report out a bill based on the report to the Second Regular Session of
29 the 131st Legislature

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (ACF) to convene a stakeholder group to examine issues related to leases of land managed by the department. The bill directs the ACF to provide staffing to the stakeholder group within existing budgeted resources. The ACF has indicated that current staff cannot absorb additional work. The impact on other programs and services within the ACF cannot be determined at this time.
